Minutes from the May 5, 2016, Meeting

President Frances Kelley called the meeting to order at 9:35 am. She welcomed Martha Herbert back from her long absence. Frances read a thank you note from Kristen Miller and Susan Bailey from the Nurse and Family Partnership thanking the guild for deciding to donate tummy quilts to their clients.

Treasurer's Report: Timi Bronson reported income for the month of \$648.25, expenses of \$420.52 and current balance of \$5,474.54. Timi has packets of tickets for the 2017 Opportunity Quilt. Members were asked to check their name on the sheet when they take a packet.

Frances reported that there were technical difficulties getting the April minutes to some members. Harriett Whitlock asked any member that did not receive a copy to notify her and she will mail a copy out to them.

Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as presented.

Community: Frances reminded members that the Guild is making tummy quilts for mothers with new babies. Quilts should be approximately 40 and 42 inches.

2016 Challenge: Joan Goodsell reported only 23 quilts have been turned in for the challenge. If some members have a quilt they were not able to turn in today, they can turn the quilt in at workday along with the proper paperwork. She asked members to get to the Hartsville Museum at 10:00 am on June 2nd so that voting and presentation of ribbons can be completed in time to get to the luncheon.

Library: Frances Kelley won the drawing.

QSC: Karen Kirkland announced that the Fall Retreat will be held October 20, 21, 22, 2016. Check in will be Wednesday evening October 19.

Workday: Susan Rayment reported that Rita Studdard will teach a class on mug rugs. The class will be held in the big room (where monthly meeting is held). June workday will include a class on note book covers.

Block of the Month: Lorene Arnette explained the block for June. It is "Something Old, Something New Something Borrowed, and Something Blue." You may use any color you want, but you must also use some blue. Though there is no meeting in July, if members would like to make a 12 1/2 (unfinished) block using red, white, and blue fabrics, the blocks will be used in a Quilt of Valor. Jonnie Britton won the blocks this month.

Vice President Wanda Moody introduced Susan Congdon who presented a trunk show on bags.

Frances presented Susan Congdon a thank you gift which was made by Harriett Whitlock. Frances reminded members of programs for upcoming months. August- Quilters Gallery, Patti Cline will give a program at meeting and then teach a class on Friday. Cost will be \$25.00. September Rita Studdard will do a chenille demonstration. October Heather Tighe will do a trunk show and teach a class on Friday.

Wanda Moody reported information she has gotten so far on a day trip to the Asheville NC quilt show.

The cost for the bus will be approximately \$53.00 per person. She asked for a show of hands of members interested. She will continue to contact other vendors and give update at next meeting.


