10:00 to 4:00 Bring a bag lunch

- 1. A hoop sturdy enough to handle sandwiched
- Between needles size 9, 10 or 11.
- 3. Hand quilting thread either cotton or poly covered cotton color to match quilt top
- 4. 18.5 inch sandwiched practice top or if you took the applique class and have completed the top sandwich that
- Thimble if you use one (recommended)
- Use safety pens to baste top together and not adhesive spray

February BLOCK OF THE MONTH

February 2018 Block of the Month -Rail Fence, In honor of the birthday month of President Abraham Lincoln, we will make a very simple Rail Fence block for February.

All seam allowances are 1/4". Block size: 12" finished (12-1/2" unfinished)

Cut six strips 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" (or use Jelly Roll). First/top strip is **VERY** dark; last/bottom strip is natural muslin. Join strips lengthwise and graduate through colors from dark to light. Make as many as you like.

BRING BOTH JAN. AND FEB. BLOCKS for a double drawing!



The 2018 UFO Challenge

For this Challenge, a UFO is any quilt or quilted item that you have begun, but not finished as of December 31, 2017. This includes any items for which you have done significant planning (have the fabrics and a pattern), as well as those on which you have begun cutting or sewing. It *does not* include quilts you've thought about doing making, but have not started the planning (fabric selection). It also does not include any quilting you may be doing for someone else for payment.

Here are the rules, they are VERY simple!!

- 1. Make two lists of the UFOs you wish to complete this year. Give me one copy, keep the other for yourself.
- 2. Work on your UFOs at your own pace.
- 3. Bring in your COMPLETELY FINISHED UFOs and show them off during our Sew and Tell time during our meetings or post pictures on our Facebook page!
- 4. For each UFO completed, you will receive one entry for the Grand Prize to be awarded at the January 2019 meeting!
