Tips for tangled Threads:

To prevent tangled knots when hand sewing, hold your thumb over the point where the thread is being pulled through until the thread is taut.

When sewing by hand, if your thread tends to kink, you may be rolling the needle. The easiest way to prevent this is to rotate the needle every few stitches to 'unwind' the thread as you go.

For tangle free thread, make sure to pull the thread wide in a circular motion away from your body, so that the thread rests easily and will not become caught up with your next stitch.
