## Minutes of the Meeting of the Swamp Fox Quilt Guild

August 2, 2018

President Beth Twedell called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. She asked if there were any additions or corrections to the June minutes. Sharon Wolff made a motion to accept the minutes as presented.

Beth reminded members that the challenge quilts at the museum will be taken down on Wednesday September 5<sup>th</sup>. Members who would like to pick up their quilts be at the museum at 10:00 am. , otherwise quilts should be picked up at the regular September meeting on September 6<sup>th</sup>. If you are unable to attend the meeting please make arrangements for someone to get your quilt. Beth also reported that several Quilts of Valor quilt tops were made at the special workday on July 6<sup>th</sup>.

**2019 Opportunity Quilt:** Linda Smiley reported that the quilt top has been completed and she will show it at sew and tell.

Beth thanked Linda Smiley for donating the door prize that was won by Rosemary Carroll.

**Treasurer's Report:** Timi Bronson reported income for the month of \$132.50, expenses of \$66.91 and the current balance is \$5,498.13.

**Membership:** Jonnie Britton reported 41 members present and 1 guest.

**Block of the Month:** Lorene Arnette announced that the block for September will be a quilter's choice using fall colors. Block should be 12 ½ square with muslin background. Lorene Arnette was the winner of the August blocks.

**Program:** Harriett Whitlock thanked everyone for their entry of panel quilts. She said each quilt hanging has a number. Please vote for your favorite. She will announce the winner at the end of the meeting.

Harriet explained the crayon challenge. She passed around bags with crayons and asked each member to close their eyes and pick two crayons from the bag. You can make anything you want but it must be made with only the colors you pick and two neutrals. Complete rules will be in the newsletter. Challenge is due at the January meeting.

Harriet reminded everyone about the class on Friday with Liz Florom. She said there were problems with people signing up for the class and then deciding not to take it. She thinks some rules need to be put in place to make the process clear reference sign up and refunds.
