Block of the Month-October

October Block of the Month will be a 15-inch diagonally (on point) Strip Pieced Block. Use a 15-inch square tissue paper, or other thin paper for your foundation. Place your first strip across the center of the foundation paper from corner to corner.

Start with a dark fabric for your center strip and proceed with as many different and varied width strips and as many different colors as you wish. The more (variety, scrappier, colorful) you have the better.

Do not square up your completed block; let the winner of the blocks do that.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Swamp Fox Quilt Guild

September 6, 2018

She also reminded everyone to be sure to get their challenge quilt from the back table. Beth announced Martha Herbert was the winner of the Viewer Choice Award.

Beth asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the August meeting. GwynAnne Sawyer made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Jane Wegner.

Beth read several thank you notes from mothers who received tummy time quilts.

<u>Workday:</u> Carol Ann Hobbs reported that she will be away on workday. Those interested in working on an I Spy Quilt should bring their machines. Martha Herbert and Kathy Percy will be there to lead the program.

Beth announced the Nominating Committee for this year. Members include Rosemary Carroll, Chairperson, Tish VonHagel and Harry Sue Cockfield.

QSC: Harriett Whitlock reported that the gift basket for the fall retreat is here. She will welcome additional donations. Harriett reminded members that the spring meeting will be held March 22-24. Ann Shaw will be the speaker at the meeting on March 23rd.

<u>Programs:</u> Harriett Whitlock announced that Nancy Horsley will be teaching a class on Friday. Cookie Washington will do a trunk show at the October meeting and will teach a quilt-as-you-go class on Thursday afternoon. The class will cost \$25.00.

Harriett reported the Board of Directors met this morning and have approved new rules for signing up and paying for classes. Members will be required to fill out a registration form and include payment in order to be signed up for a class. There will be no refunds. There will be no visitors or auditing at classes.

Nancy Wright brought in two boxes of fabric donated by Phyllis Lee. The fabric belonged to her mother Audrene Thomas who was a founding member of the guild.

Beth thanked Sharon Wolff and Alice Hulsey for the refreshment this month.

<u>Christmas Bazaar:</u> Wanda Moody explained how the silent auction will work. She reminded members that only hand crafted items, baked goods and plants should be donated. She asked members to bring a bag to transport your purchases.

Community: Frances Kelley reported that 5 walker totes, 25 tummy time quilts, 20 wheelchair quilts and 19 pillowcases have been turned in.



A tip revealed on TV last month: If you are having trouble telling which is the correct side of your batting, think: dimples good, pimples bad. Batting is needle punched to hold the fibers together. The indented little needle marks are dimples (think pretty). The back side has little raised bumps made by the needle (think pimples that stick up, bad). Thus the side next to your top is the dimple side!
